KMC offered at HFs

- Health workers place all newborns STS immediately after birth, weigh and identify those eligible for KMC (<2000g)
- Health workers counsel caregivers on KMC
- Optional: CHWs identify and refer small newborns to KMC facilities

- HF staff: continue LBW newborns in KMC position, support early & exclusive BF & formally admit to KMC and/or refer
- HF staff monitor & record per protocol: feeding, STS duration, temperature, breathing, heart rate, urine/stools; and assess daily for weight and complications
- HF staff: assess progress and discharge according to criteria; establish follow-up plan and counsel caregivers on follow-up; record discharge
- Optional: HF staff inform CHWs of KMC clients requiring follow-up

Caregivers and families

- Mothers deliver at HF or arrange for skilled provider at home
- Families recognize small newborns and seek care
- Caregivers accept initiation of KMC services
- Caregivers practice recommended STS duration and feeding practices (using surrogate as needed)
- Caregivers adhere with referrals if needed

- Caregivers remain in facility-KMC until newborn meets discharge criteria
- Family comfortable with KMC position and breastfeeding
- Caregivers continue to practice KMC in community
- Caregivers attend follow-up visits as recommended until graduation
